## Summary of Information NCAA Graduation Rates Report 2017-18 Cohort

The <u>Federal Graduation Rate</u> shows the percentage of first-time freshmen who were enrolled full-time and entered the University during the 2017-18 academic year who graduated within six-years. For student-athletes, it only counts those first-time

The Student-Athlete <u>Academic Success Rate (ASR)</u> also includes students who transferred into the University and participated in athletics, those that enrolled mid-year and participated, and first-time freshmen who were not receiving athletics scholarship that participated in athletics. The ASR also removes student-athletes who left prior to graduation that had athletics eligibility remaining but were reported as academically ELIGIBLE when they left the University.

The <u>Four-Class Average</u> combines the given year data (2017-18) with the three previous freshman classes using the data from the previous years.

In sum, the Graduation Rate for student-athletes for this cohort decreased slightly from the previous cohort year but remained within a consistent range of three-years of cohorts. The Academic Success Rate for this cohort decreased slightly but remains near the 80<sup>th</sup>-percentile from the last four-year average. Furthermore, the four-year average for student-athletes is higher than that of the general student body.

Student-athletes in this cohort graduated above the overall undergraduate enrollment in this cohort and the four-class average is the higher as that of the general student body. Lastly, the academic success rate, while dipping from the previous three years, still remains high for student-athletes.

The Graduation Rates Institu, on Report gives graduation information about the most recent sixyear graduating class of students and studentathletes who entered as freshmen in 2017-18. The graduation rate (percent) is based on a comparison of the number (N) of students who entered a college or university and the number of those who graduated within six years. For example, if 100 students entered and 60 graduated within six years, the graduation rate is 60 percent.

All undergraduate students who were enrolled in a full-time program of study for their baccalaureate degree; and

Student-athletes who received athletics aid from the school for any period during their entering year. [Note: Athletics aid is a grant, scholarship, tuition waiver or other assistance from a college or university that is awarded based on a student's athletic ability.]

Two different measures of graduation rates are presented in this report: Federal Graduation Rate and NCAA Division II Academic Success RateASR). The Federal Graduation Rate indicates the percentage of freshmen who entered and received athletics aid during a given academic yeawho graduated within six years. The ASR adds to the first-time freshmen, those students who entered midyear, first-time freshmen who did not receive athletics aid but participated in athletics (i.e., walk-ons), as well as studentathletes who transferred into an institution, received athletics aid or were on the roster at the start of the championship seasontheir first year at the institution. Both the Federal Graduation Rate and the ASR subtract students from the entering cohort who are considered allowable exclusions (i.e., those who either die or become permanently disabled, those who leave the school to join the armed forces, foreign services orembark on a religious mission). In addition, the ASR subtracts those who left the institution prior to graduation, but had athletics eligibility remaining and would have been academically eligible to compete had they returned to the institution.
